





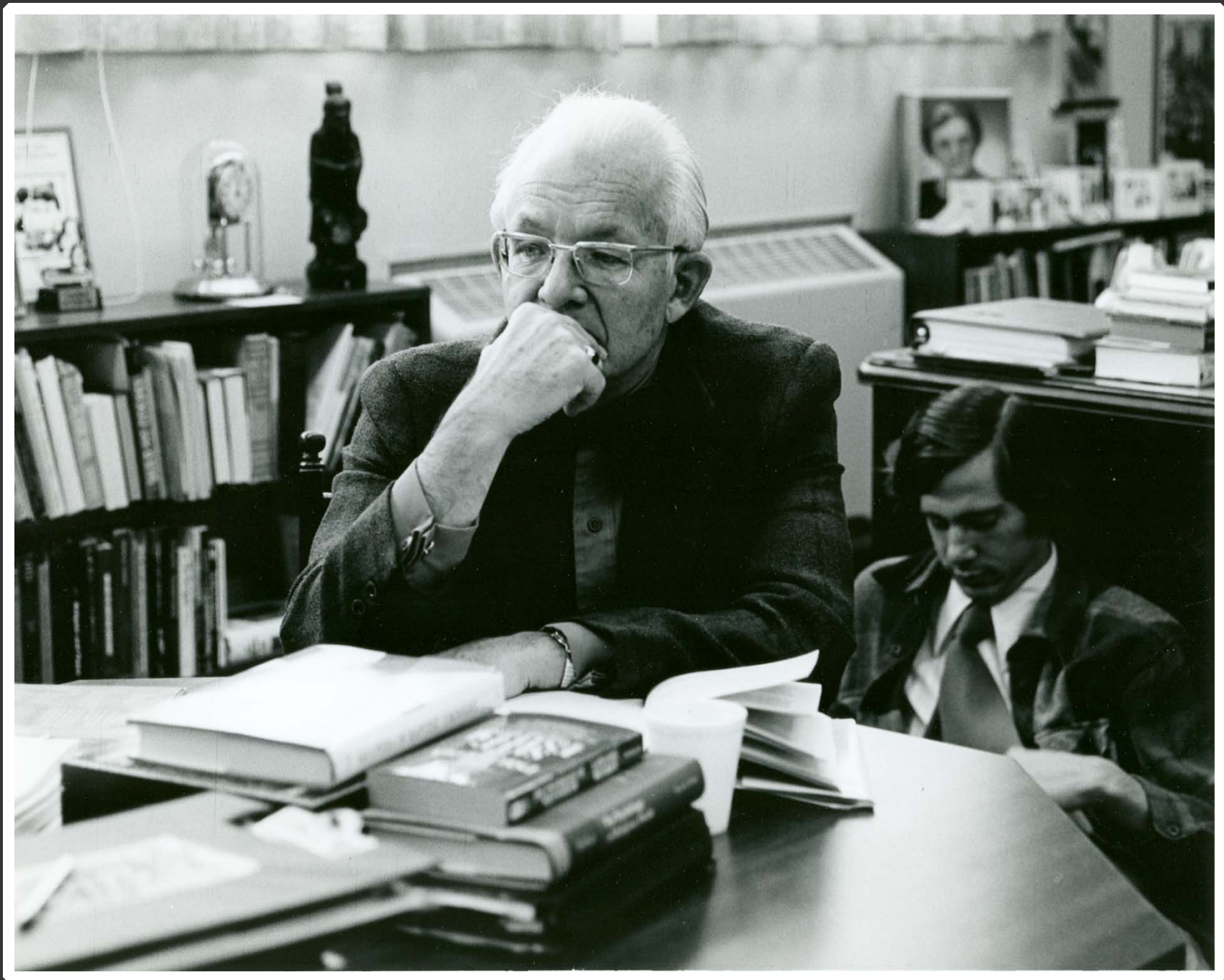

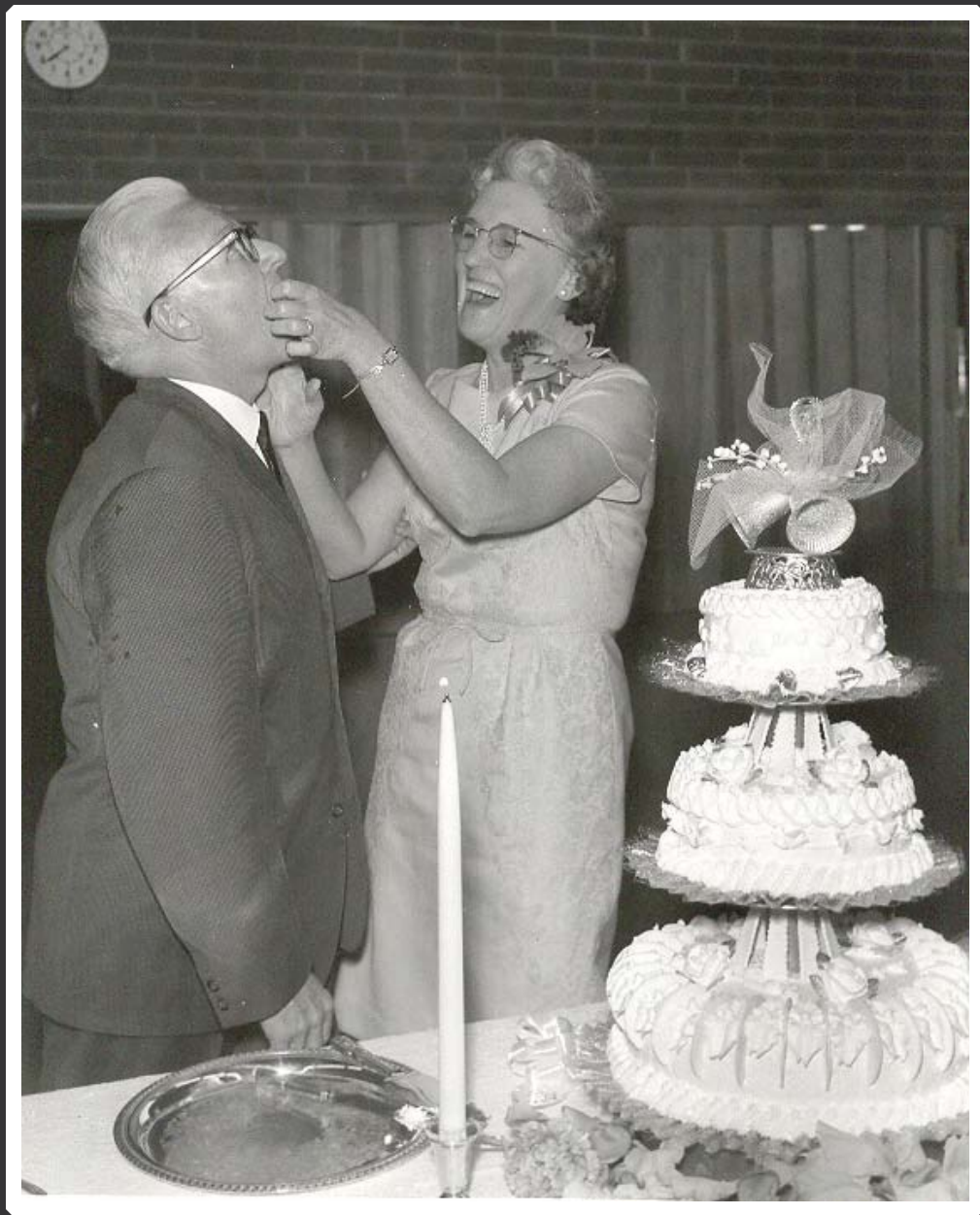


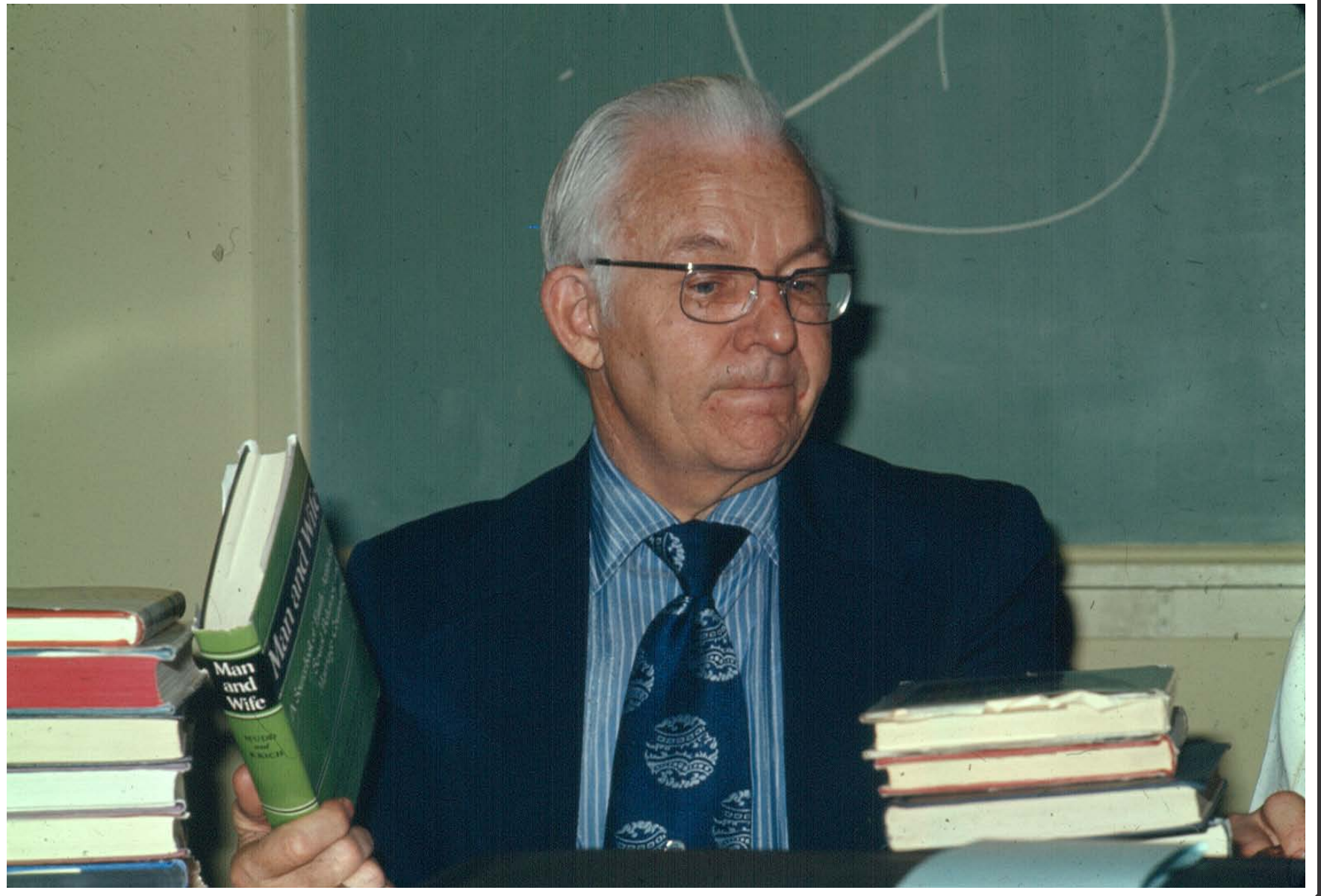

"Do it again, God! Do it again!"







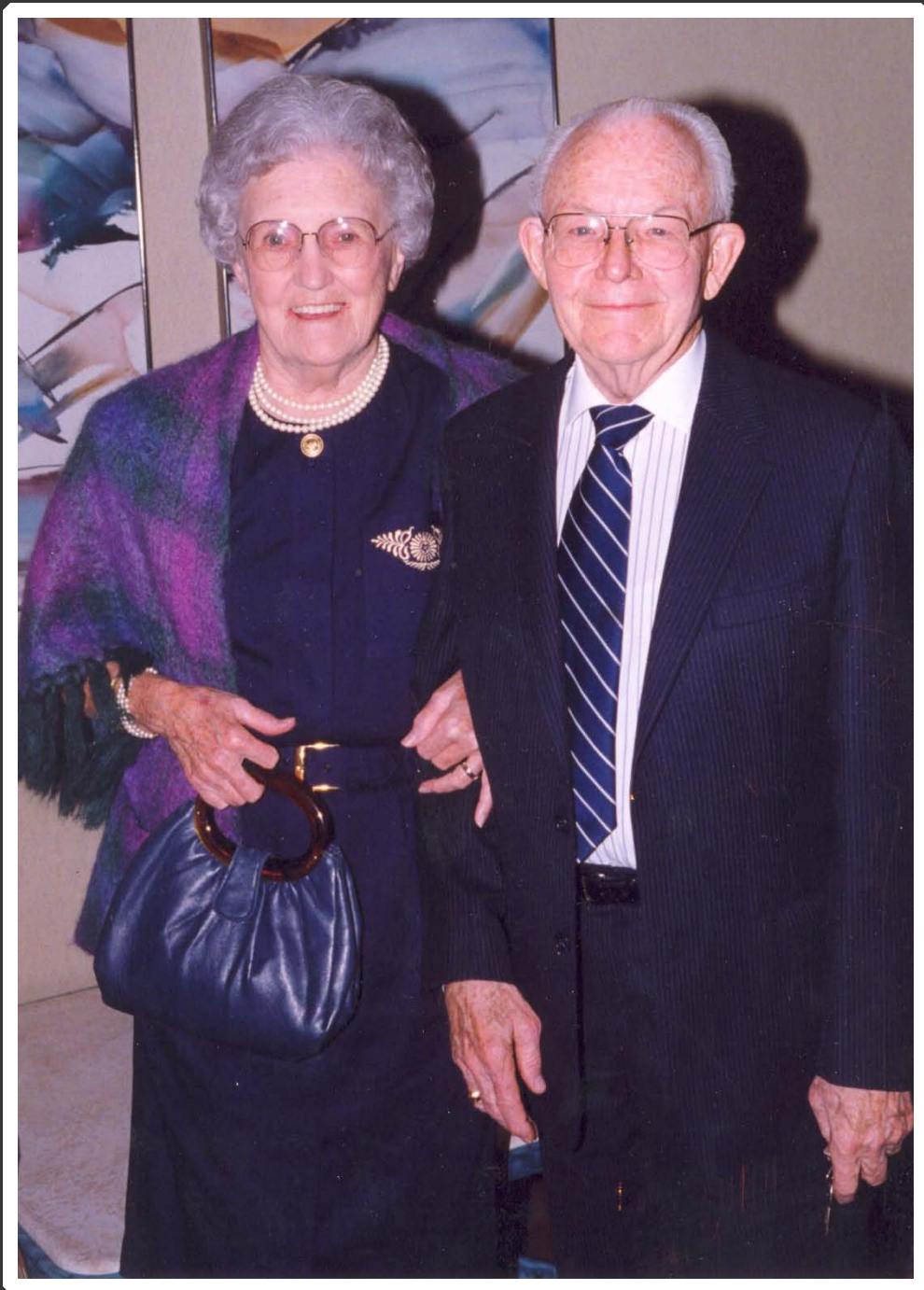
FROM DR. VERNON GROUNDS:

coffee at meetings like this one.”*





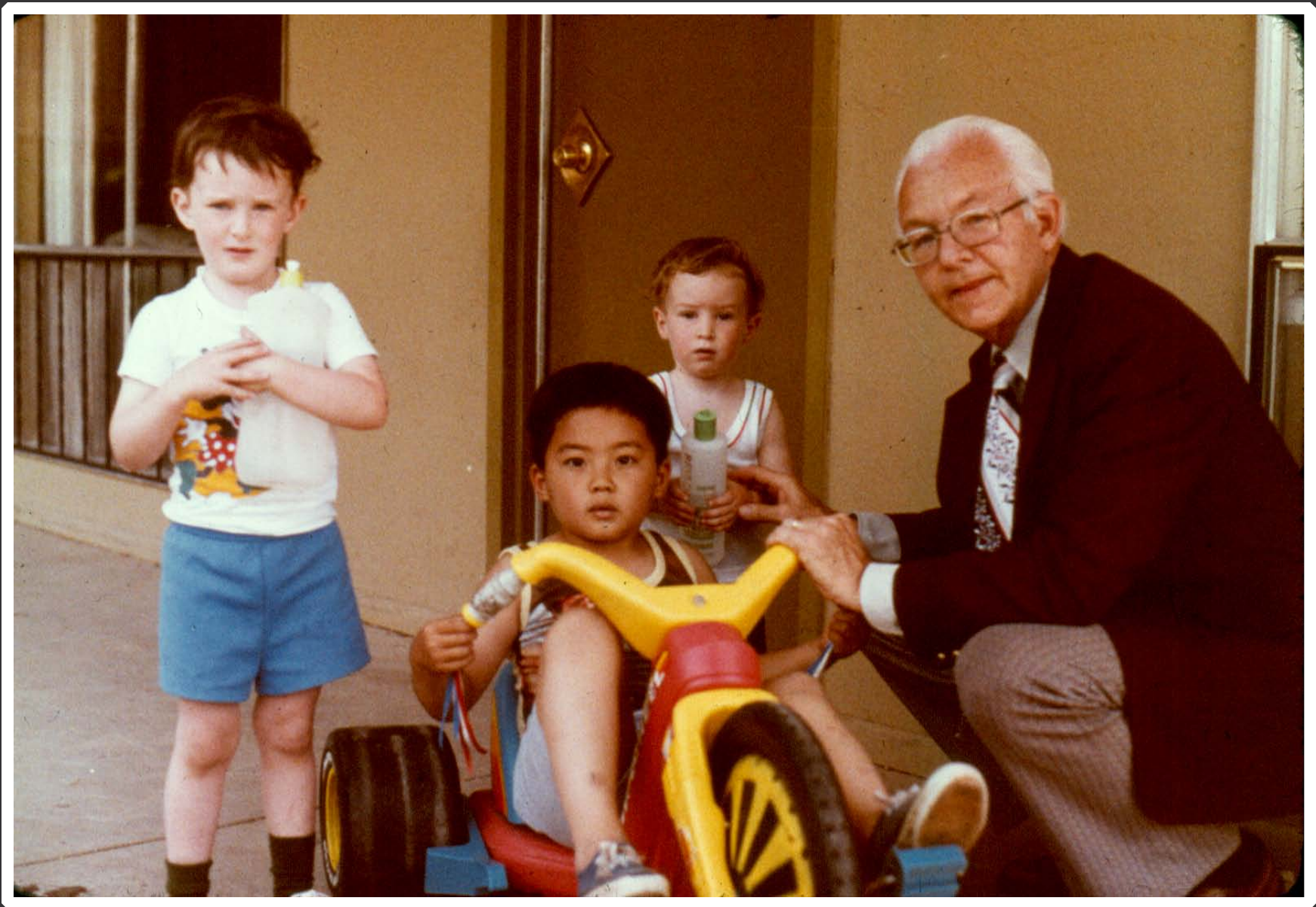


FROM DR. VERNON GROUNDS:

Did he live for it too?













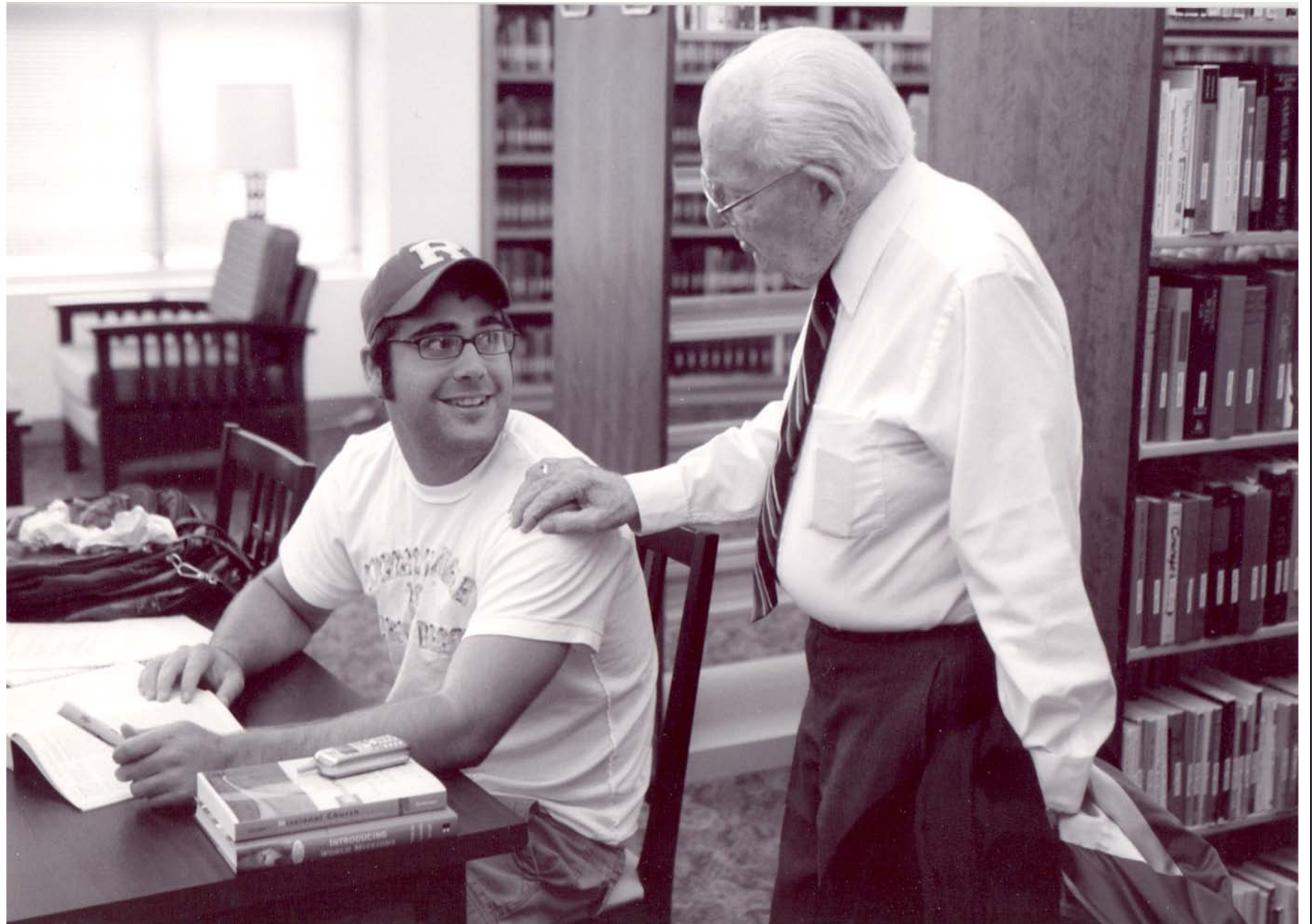

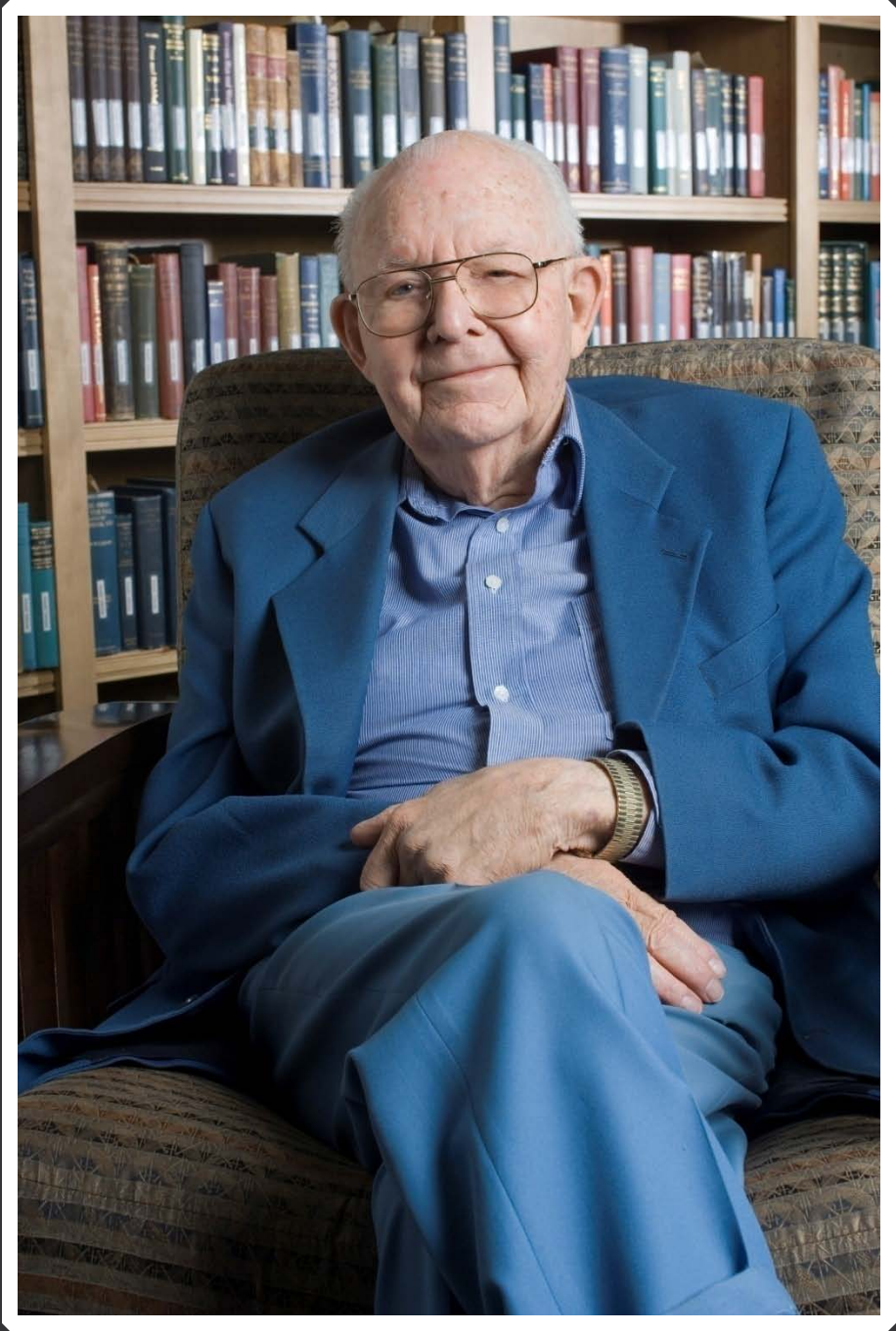
I often confess that I would probably be a rather pathetic martyr – unless under some intolerable pressure God gave me an infusion of courage and grace.
